

What does an Ambassador Do?

Urban Waters Federal Partnership's approach is to:

- coordinate with local partners;
- connect locations with federal tools & resources; and
- share learnings to multiply results across the country

Ambassadors are the mechanism to make this happen on the ground. Ambassadors have three key roles:

Coordinate, Navigate and Communicate




What is the Current Status?

20 Locations:

- 16 Ambassadors on board.
- 4 of the 16 are full-time

Examples of Models Used?

- IPA (Interagency Personnel Action) with NGO or local government (New Orleans, Los Angeles)
- IA (inter-agency agreement) cost-sharing staff (St. Louis)
- RFP/Grant (DC via NGO, Passaic & Puerto Rico via NEP)
- CDC Health Intern (San Antonio)
- Shared Staff Private/Nonprofit (Grand Rapids)
- Contract with Private Company (Baltimore, Philadelphia)
- Contract with Non-profit Academic (NW Indiana -Purdue University, Green-Duwamish - watershed group)



Benefits of Ambassadors

- Results on the ground (including early wins)
- Make results visible (attracts additional support)
- Overcome barriers (sustained focus)
- Trusted neutral convener (overcome "cooperetition")
- Collective impact ("backbone organization")
- Courting new resources (requires relationships, focus)
 - Authentic community engagement
- Sustained action


