Findings of Failure to Submit State Implementation Plans Required for Attainment of the 2010 1-Hour Primary Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS)

FACT SHEET

ACTION

• On October 8, 2020, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) found that Indiana, Louisiana, Guam, and Puerto Rico failed to submit complete State Implementation Plans (SIPs) showing how areas in the following table will address nonattainment of the 2010 1-hour primary Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS):

State/Territory	Area Name
Indiana	Huntington County
Louisiana	Evangeline Parish
Guam	Piti-Cabras
Puerto Rico	Guayama-Salinas San Juan

- These findings of failure to submit attainment plans for the 2010 SO₂ NAAQS establish a 24-month deadline for EPA to either approve SIPs for the affected areas or finalize Federal Implementation Plans (FIPs) that address attainment in each area.
- This action also establishes deadlines for the implementation of two mandatory sanctions that will begin if the named states or territories do not submit complete SIPs:
 - 1. Eighteen months after the effective date of these findings, a 2-to-1 offset ratio under the nonattainment New Source Review (NSR) permitting program will go into effect, such that for every unit of SO₂ emissions a new or modified source will contribute to the nonattainment area, two units must be reduced.
 - 2. Six months after the date of offset sanctions, federal highway funding may be withheld.
- EPA is committed to working with Indiana, Louisiana, Guam, and Puerto Rico to expedite the development and submission of nonattainment area SIPs for these areas, and to review and act on their submissions in accordance with the requirements of the Clean Air Act.

BACKGROUND

- On June 22, 2010, EPA promulgated a new 1-hour SO₂ NAAQS of 75 part per billion (ppb), which is met at an ambient air quality monitoring site when the 3-year average of the annual 99th percentile of daily maximum 1-hour average concentrations does not exceed 75 ppb.
- On January 9, 2018, EPA, as part of its third round of initial area designations for the 2010 SO₂ NAAQS, designated five areas of the country as nonattainment for the 1-hour primary 2010 SO₂ NAAQS: Huntington County, IN; Evangeline Parish, LA; Piti-Cabras, GU; and Guayama-Salinas and San Juan, PR.
- Within 18 months of the effective date of a nonattainment area designation, the Clean Air Act requires affected states to submit a SIP demonstrating how the area will meet the standard by the attainment date. For areas designated nonattainment for the 1-hour SO₂ NAAQS on January 9, 2018, with an effective date of April 9, 2018, SIPs were due to EPA by October 9, 2019. These plans were to show how affected areas would meet the standard as expeditiously as practicable but no later than April 9, 2023.
- Nonattainment area SIPs for the 2010 SO2 NAAQS must include:
 - o an accurate inventory of current emissions for all sources of SO₂ within the nonattainment area;
 - o a nonattainment New Source Review (NSR) permit program;
 - o an attainment demonstration using an EPA approved air quality dispersion model;
 - the adoption of reasonably available control measures (RACM), including reasonably available control technology (RACT);
 - o a Reasonable Further Progress (RFP) plan; and,
 - o contingency measures.
