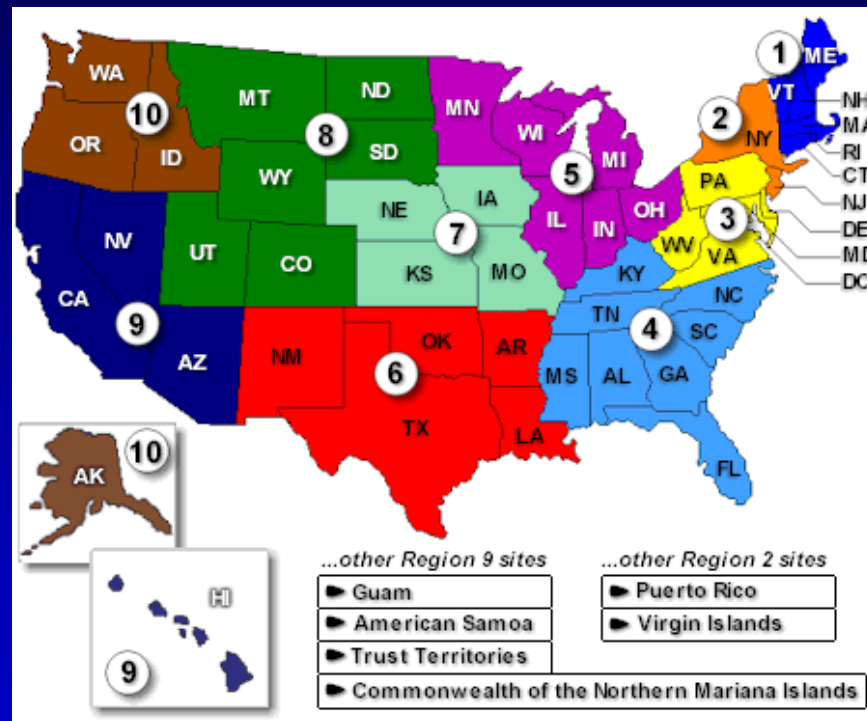

Who is ATSDR

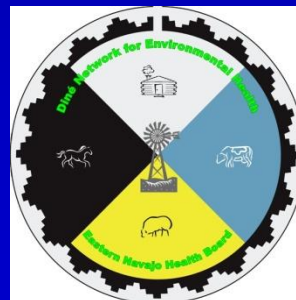
- A federal public health agency and part of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) based in Atlanta, Georgia
- Created by the (EPA) Superfund Law in 1980
- Approximately 350 staff in Atlanta and in 10 Regional Offices that are co-located with U.S. EPA.
- Regional Representatives coordinate with public health and environmental agencies and provide information to communities and agencies involved at a site.

Center for Disease Control

- Follow Up Activities
- CDC coordinated with NNEPA, NNDOH, and ATSDR to organize a two day scientific and communication training for 45 Navajo CHRs and other public health workers.
- CHR's visited every study participant to review results and answer questions and invite them to the Indian Health Service screening program.
- CHR's also reported results back to Chapter Houses
- CDC tested follow up water sources identified and coordinated with US EPA

Center for Disease Control

- Follow up Educational Activities
- Identified knowledge gaps in the community
- Developed a safe water use public health campaign with NNEPA and NNDOH (CDC contributed \$25,000.)
- Materials include 3,500 pamphlets, magnets, and radio ads (English and Navajo).

Center for Disease Control

- Investigation of Drinking Water Exposures from Unregulated Water Sources in Dennehotso, Ganado, Lower Greasewood, Red Mesa, and Steamboat Chapters, Navajo Nation.
