Highlights since the 2009 Five-Year Review

ASARCO emerged from bankruptcy in 2009 and awarded \$16 million specifically for work on the site.

Pilot studies were completed in 2010. The State is proposing an alternative cleanup method in early 2011 via a ROD amendment. Specific cleanup timeframes will be known after the ROD amendment is complete.
