**SUBJECT:** Availability of FY 2010 Clean Water Act Title VI Funds

Final enacted FY 2010 Clean Water Act Title VI funding is now available with passage of the FY 2010 Appropriations Act. This memorandum provides final state allotments based on the national appropriation of \$2,100,000,000. It is important to note that the formula for allotting CWSRF funds to the States is slightly different compared to previous years. Specifically, the FY 2010 Appropriations Act increases the Indian Tribes Set-Aside from 1.5% to 2.0% and provides an additional 1.2486% of the funds available to the States to American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, and the United States Virgin Islands.

The Appropriations Act also requires that a portion of each capitalization grant be used for additional subsidization and funding green projects. To assist the States, a chart has been included that shows the maximum amount that may be and the minimum amount that must be provided as additional subsidization. The chart also shows the minimum amount that has to go towards green projects. We are also in the process of developing procedures for implementing certain provisions of the FY 2010 Appropriations Act that affect the CWSRF program. We expect that the procedures will be distributed to the Regions and the States shortly.

Payments to the Automated Standard Application for Payments (ASAP) from the FY 2010 allotment begin in the quarter in which the capitalization grant is awarded. All payments must be made no later than eight quarters after the capitalization grant is awarded or the second quarter of FY 2013, whichever is earlier.

1. The FY 2010 Appropriation Act requires that not less than 30% of the funds made available to each State for CWSRF capitalization grants shall be used by the State to provide additional subsidy to eligible recipients in the form of forgiveness of principal, negative interest loans, or grants. However, this requirement only applies to the portion of the CWSRF capitalization grant appropriation that exceeds \$1 Billion.

2. The FY 2010 Appropriation Act requires that to the extent that there are sufficient eligible projects, not less than 20% of the funds made available to each State for CWSRF capitalization grants shall be used by the State for projects to address green infrastructure, water or energy efficiency improvements, or other environmentally innovative activities.
