Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) regulations (40 CFR Parts 1500-1508), and the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) NEPA Review authority under Section 309 of the Clean Air Act (CAA), we have reviewed the U.S. Coast Guard's Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) for the Cabrillo Port Liquefied Natural Gas Deepwater Port. This project is proposed by BHP Billiton LNG International, Inc. (BHPB) and includes receiving, storage, and re-gasification facilities and associated pipelines, to be located in deep waters off the coast of Ventura County, California.

The Deepwater Port Act (DPA), 33 U.S.C. § 1504(e)(2), Section 9(b) provides the Governor of adjacent coastal states, in this case California, with certain authorities, including the opportunity to notify the Secretary of the Department of Transportation on whether a deepwater port license would be consistent with state programs relating to environmental protection, land and water use, and coastal zone management. On Friday, May 18, 2007, Governor Schwarzenegger disapproved the application of BHPB for construction and operation of Cabrillo Port. In light of the Governor's action, any comments we might have on the FEIS have become moot.
