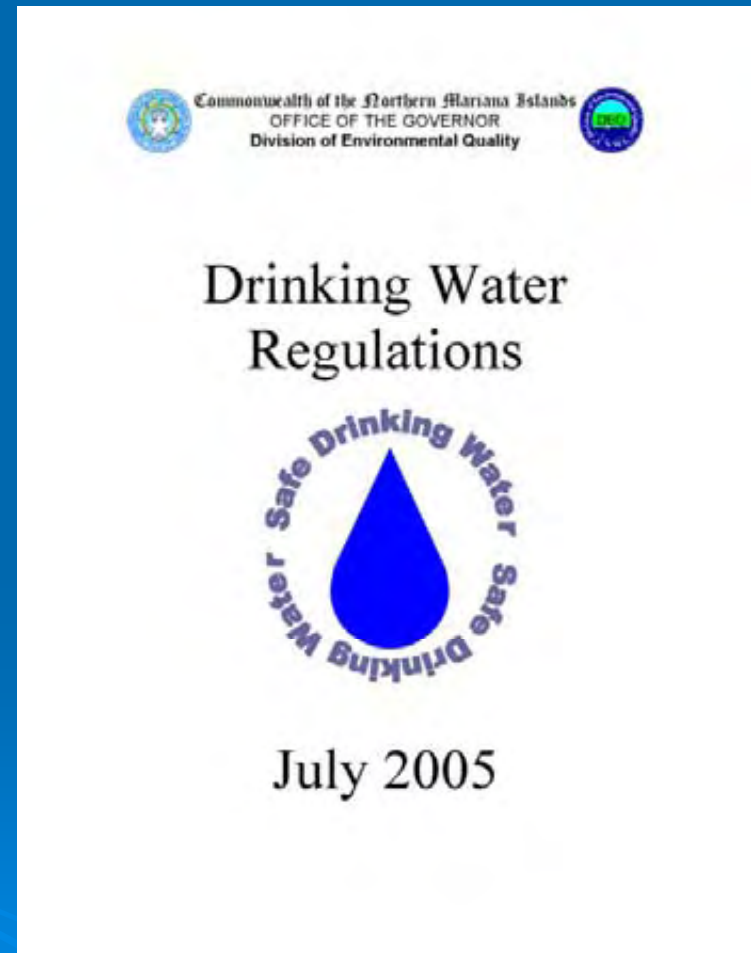

New Regulations in CNMI

- July 2005 new CNMI Drinking Water Regs
- All PWS to have certified operators by January 2006



Certification Requirements

- High School Education
- At least one year work experience
- Pass an exam



Maintaining Certification

- Operators required to have 30 hours of Continuing Education in three years to renew certification

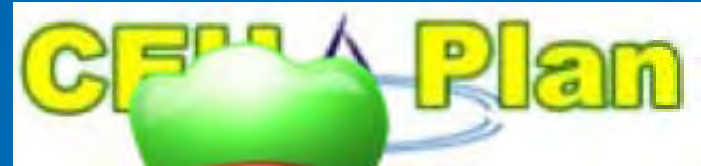


CNMI DEQ Provides Training

- For two years, from Sept 2006 to Nov 2008, CNMI DEQ conducted continuing education training for water operators
- 3 hour class once a quarter
- 12 hours offered in one year
- FREE (funded under an EPA grant)
- **Grant fund expended at end of 2008**
- Now what do operators do?

Other Training Options

- On-line courses
- Correspondence courses
- Employer training
- Conferences
- Expensive
- May not be available to all operators



Another Option!

- Several operators decided to form an Association
- The Mission: Provide training and career development opportunities for managers and operators of water and waste water utilities.
- Something like an AWWA or WEF affiliate, but much lower cost.

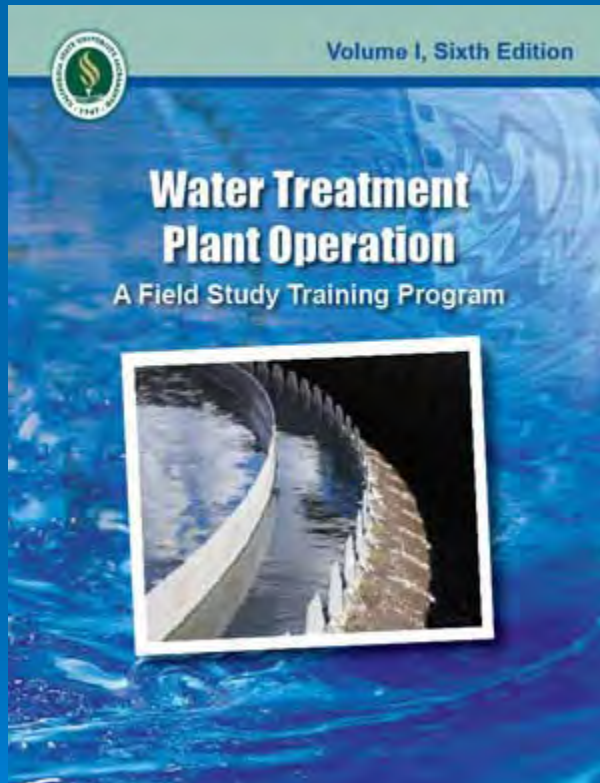
- Second class on May 13, 2009
