

Containment Rule Determination Resource Guide

The purpose of this document is to help you determine whether the Federal Containment Regulations apply to you and if the regulations require you to have a **Secondary Containment Unit** and/or a **Containment Pad.**

Step I: Do the Containment Regulations apply to me?

Do you handle agricultural pesticides and are you one or more of the following?

- A refilling establishment whose principal business (50% or more) is retail sales:
- 2. A commercial pesticide applicator;
- 3. A custom blender?

If no, to <u>all</u> of these questions, Containment Regulations do not apply to you.

If yes, to any of these questions, go to Step II.

Step II:

Do the Secondary Containment Regulations apply to me?

Do you have:

One or more **Stationary Pesticide Containers** that hold 500 gallons or more of a liquid pesticide or 4,000 pounds or more of dry pesticides?

If no, then Secondary Containment is not needed, however you may still need a Containment Pad. Go to Step III.

If yes, you must have a Secondary Containment Unit* unless an exemption applies. Go to Step III to determine if you also need a Containment Pad.

Step III: Do the Containment Pad Regulations apply to me?

- 1. Do you empty, clean or rinse refillable containers;
- 2. Do you dispense pesticides from a stationary container designed to hold 500 gallons or more of liquid pesticide or 4,000 pounds or more of dry pesticide for any purpose;
- 3. Do you dispense pesticides from a transport vehicle for the purpose of refilling a refillable container (bulk container or minibulk):
- 4. Do you dispense pesticides from any container to refill a refillable container for sale or distribution?

If No or Yes

If no, to <u>all</u> of these questions, a Containment Pad** is not required.

If yes, to <u>any</u> of these questions, you must have a **Containment Pad** unless an exemption applies.

* Exemptions for Secondary Containment Unit are:

- Empty containers
- Containers holding rinsate or wash water (and are labeled as such);
- Containers holding gaseous pesticides at normal atmospheric pressure; and
- Containers dedicated to non-pesticide use (and are labeled as such).

** Exemptions for Containment Pad dispensing area are:

- If you only have gaseous pesticides;
- If you only have stationary containers already protected by a secondary containment unit; and/or
- If the area is used only for dispensing from a (non-stationary) rail car in place less than 30 days.

Definition of a **Stationary Pesticide Container** is a refillable container that is fixed at a single facility or establishment, or if not fixed that remains at a facility for 30 consecutive days or more and holds pesticides the entire time.
