We appreciate the opportunity to review the subject document pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) regulations (40 CFR Parts 1500-1508), and our NEPA review authority under Section 309 of the Clean Air Act. EPA previously rated the Draft Environmental Impact Statement EC-2, "Environmental Concerns - Insufficient Information," in our August 16, 2010 letter, due to our concerns about air quality and growth inducing impacts.

We commend the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for reducing Phase 4a and 4b emissions of nitrogen oxides (NOx) by 37 tons from 2011 to 2016. The Corps' mitigation measures (collectively 4.11-a) double the NOx reduction target from the Draft Environmental Impact Statement from 20% to 40% (below the most recent California Air Resources Board fleet average at the time of construction). This allows the project to remain below the de minimis threshold for EPA's Conformity rule. We remind the Corps to incorporate mitigation measure 4.11-a into the Record of Decision (ROD) for both Phase 4a and 4b.
