Whereas: Healthy people and healthy communities are the centerpiece of a strong

and vibrant society; and

Whereas: Skin cancer cases make up almost half of all cancer diagnoses each year

in the United States; and

Whereas: More than one million Americans will be diagnosed with skin cancer this

year; and

Whereas: One in five Americans will be diagnosed with skin cancer during their

lifetime; and

Whereas: Skin cancer affects people of all skin types; and

Whereas: Exposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation is the number one preventable risk

factor for the development of skin cancer; and

Whereas: The City of Boston is a national leader in work to eliminate racial and

ethnic disparities in health; and

Whereas: The City of Boston has made healthy living and protection of the

environment among its top priorities; and

Whereas: The City of Boston, in order to reduce the urban heat island effect, energy

use, the city's net emissions of carbon dioxide and the lack of shade, and protect its residents from heat exhaustion, increased air pollution, higher energy bills and overexposure to UV radiation, will plant 100,000 trees in

the city over the next 10 years; and

Whereas: SHADE Foundation of America is dedicated to the eradication of

melanoma through the education of children and the community in the prevention and detection of skin cancer and the promotion of sun safety;

and

Whereas: The SHADE Foundation of America is providing 100 trees and 10 shade

tents to provide the citizens of Boston with shade and sunscreen to protect

themselves from overexposure to the sun's UV radiation; and

Whereas: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)'s SunWise Program is

an environmental and health education program that teaches children and their caregivers how to protect themselves from overexposure to the sun through the use of classroom-, school- and community-based components;

and

Whereas: In an effort to bring sun safety information to our schools, the EPA will

provide free SunWise Tool Kits to each K-8 school in our community, so children can learn about ozone science and how to protect themselves

from the harmful effects of UV radiation; and

Whereas: The SunWise Program has provided sun safety training to educators in the

City of Boston; and

Whereas: Through interactive lessons the SunWise program offers fun and

educational ways for students to incorporate sun-safe behavior into their

lifestyles at a young age, so that they continue to spend active time

outdoors while protecting themselves from the sun;

Therefore, The City of Boston, in partnership with the SHADE Foundation of

America and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's SunWise Program, and as an advocate for protecting children's health and the environment, is becoming a SunWise City and encouraging all city students and their families to learn about and practice sun-safe behavior;

and further
