RECOMMENDED STRATEGIES TO PROMOTE SUN SAFETY AT YOUR SUMMER CAMP



Promote Professional Development Activities

 Modify staff training curriculum and orientation materials to include information related to sun protection



Encourage Family Involvement

- Include NYSDOH brochures and fact sheets on sun protection with camp information sent to parents
- Encourage parents to provide campers with sun-protective clothing, sunglasses and sunscreen



Create a Supportive Environment for Sun Safety

- Encourage the use of shaded areas and structures
- Encourage staff to be role models for sun-safe behaviors
- Prominently display sun safety posters featuring children's artwork in areas where campers and staff congregate
- Prominently display ultraviolet (UV) index rating daily



Educate Campers on Sun Safety

• Incorporate age-appropriate activities into nature, science, art, sports, waterfront and other camp activities



Establish Policies and Practices that Promote Sun Safety

- Modify inventory lists sent to campers' parents to include sun protective clothing, sunscreen and sunglasses
- Incorporate a sun protection plan into NYSDOH-mandated camp safety plans
- Sell sun protective items in the camp store



Encourage Involvement of Health Services Staff

- Reinforce children's sun-protective behaviors
- Prominently display posters about sun safety in areas where campers and staff gather
