¹ Settlement agreements may include mitigation projects and/or Supplemental Environmental Projects (SEPs). A mitigation project is an environmentally beneficial project performed as part of a settlement of alleged violations which tends to compensate the environment for past environmental harms caused by the alleged violations. The project should be related to the same media (e.g. air, water, waste) and should have a similar nexus (e.g. location) as the alleged violations. A SEP is an environmentally beneficial project that a violator of an environmental law voluntarily agrees to undertake in the settlement of a civil enforcement action. The goal of SEPs is to improve the environmental health of a community that has been placed at risk due to a violation of an environmental law. SEPs used to implement a wood burning appliance changeout/retrofit program are an effective way to leverage resources and significantly improve public health and the environment. The defendant named in the consent decree is solely responsible for choosing a location and an implementing organization, and ensuring the project is implemented in a manner consistent with the consent decree. Several states, tribes and local governments have implemented changeout programs with SEP funds. To learn more, see
