Re: Enforcement Discretion Concerning Gasoline and Diesel Fuel for the State of Florida

Dear Mr. Bedwell:

I am writing in response your September 7, 2004 request that the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) extend the exercise of enforcement discretion under my letter of September 2, 2004. As you know, due to Hurricane Frances there has been a shortage of gasoline that meets the 7.8 pounds per square inch (psi) volatility standard that is required for use in Hillsborough, Pinellas, Broward, Dade, Duval and Palm Beach counties, Florida. In addition, there has been a shortage of undyed, low sulfur diesel fuel throughout Florida. Because of these shortages, on September 2, 2004, EPA exercised enforcement discretion to allow temporary use of gasoline meeting the 9.0 psi volatility standard in these six counties, and to allow temporary use of motor vehicle diesel fuel having a visible evidence of red dye and a sulfur content exceeding 500 parts per million (ppm), until midnight, September 7<sup>th</sup>.

It now appears that the shortages of 7.8 psi gasoline and low sulfur diesel fuel will not be resolved until additional supplies of these fuels are received in Florida. For this reason, EPA will extend the enforcement discretion granted on September 2<sup>nd</sup> until midnight on Wednesday, September 15, 2004. In addition, I am exercising enforcement discretion to allow the use of gasoline with a volatility greater than 9.0 psi (winter grade gasoline) throughout the State of Florida, effective immediately, and continuing through September 15, 2004. The terms and conditions included in the September 2<sup>nd</sup> enforcement discretion letter also apply to this extension period.
