# Essay 1: Innovation

Describe the teacher's participation in environmental education through innovative approaches in his or her school or the community. Does the teacher utilize outdoor, experiential, or place-based learning? Please be sure to demonstrate or exemplify this in your supportive materials.



# Essay 2: Achievement

Describe how the teacher's work results in demonstrated student achievement of improved grades or test scores, class involvement, or positive behavior change. Where applicable, to what extent are the teacher's students further participating in the environmental field through environmental, conservation, or science extracurricular activities and/or projects?





# Essay 3: Serving the Underserved

Describe how the teacher has worked with students who are disproportionately impacted by environmental pollution. This may include minority, indigenous, low-income schools, communities, or populations. Does the teacher tailor his or her methods to serve the diverse needs of the student population being taught or advised?



#### Essay 4: Community

Describe how the teacher successfully extends environmental education beyond his or her classroom. How does the teacher serve as an inspiration or example in other classrooms and grade levels at his or her school, at other schools within his or her school district, or beyond? - **Content**. Materials from one unit/curriculum or module that the teacher has taught. Indicate how these materials were used, and how the students responded to them.
- **Source(s)**. The materials may be original to the teacher or may be from an existing education curricula source. If existing environmental education curricula or activities are submitted, the source of the materials must be documented.
- Length. The total length of the sample teaching materials may not exceed 5 pages. Materials must include a brief description about how they are used. Teachers may include up to 5 pages of photos, which must also be clearly labeled. (Note that photos are optional.) Web links to supporting teaching materials, such as photos (5 or fewer pages) and sound and/or video recordings (10 or fewer minutes total playing time) may also be provided, but must be accompanied by a brief description of the project. Reviewers will not attempt to find online content for invalid hyperlinks, so please make sure they are active.
