
Evaluating Trends Using TRI Data

- <u>EPA's National Analysis</u> includes industry sector profiles and trends analysis
- Analysis uses the <u>Federal Reserve Board's production index</u>, an economic indicator that measures output from industries
- Issues to consider when evaluating trends:
- Production will vary from year to year at most facilities based on demand and other economic conditions
- Companies may change processes (substituting one chemical for another or modifying equipment)
- Not all companies using chemicals are required to report under TRI
- Facilities that are required to report, but do not, are subject to enforcement under <u>Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-know Act Section 313 (TRI)</u>




Asarco LLC Ray Complex/Hayden Smelter & Concentrator Hayden, AZ Total Releases (1998 - 2009)




Chemical Waste Management, Inc. Kettleman City, CA Total Releases (1998 - 2009)

What does the TRI data tell you?

- TRI data is available online and provides information on facilities that release chemicals above thresholds
- Tools can be used to look at the amounts, type of chemicals and releases reported by facilities over the years as well as to compare releases by industry, year, and location.
- TRI can be used as a starting point to identify potential hazards in your neighborhood.

What does TRI not include?

- TRI cannot be used to calculate risk as key risk information such as exposure are not available. See <u>FAQs</u> regarding TRI and risk
- TRI does not include all releases from all companies.
 Only includes releases for companies that are required to report <u>TRI-listed</u> chemicals
- Companies must report to TRI if they meet all three criteria:
 - TRI-listed industry
 - 10 or more employee equivalents
 - Above threshold for TRI chemicals

What do I do if I have a concern?

- Situations will vary but the following people/groups should be able to help:
- <u>Facility Representative</u> (contact info in TRI)
- <u>Local health department</u> or <u>local political</u>
 <u>representative</u>
- State Air Quality District
- EPA or State TRI Coordinator

Additional EPA Data Sources and Tools

- TRI Program Data and Tools, a variety of applications and online databases to analyze, map, compare and access TRI data
- Risk-Screening Environmental Indicators (RESI) Tool used to rank relative risk among facilities in a particular area
- <u>FedCenter's My Community / My Facility Page</u>, provides numerous data systems for looking up information in your neighborhood
