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Function of a Tribal Conservation District

To make available technical, financial, and educational resources, whatever their source, & focus or coordinate them so that they meet the needs of the local land user for: conservation, development, restoration & preservation of soil, water, air, plants, animals, and related resources.



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Tribal Law – usually by Resolution

NRCS - ONE agency within United States
Department of Agriculture (USDA)

ONLY AGENCY WITHIN USDA THAT IS NON-REGULATORY

- USDA Secretary recognizes Tribal Conservation Districts with 3-way MOU
 - Tribal Government
 - Tribal Conservation District
 - Department of Agriculture



USDA

- Federal to meet Tribal needs at the Department level
 - Agencies within USDA: NRCS, RD, RMA, FSA, USFS, etc.
